Schedule for Succos, Shmini Atzeres 5784

Please note the following nihugim of the Yeshiva:

- A) For the bracha of Leisheiv, the bracha on eating covers sleeping, but only if done in the same succah. Therefore:
1. If one eats and sleeps in the same succah, one does not make a bracha on sleeping. Even if one eats dinner, goes inside for a little while, and then returns to go to sleep, one is not mevarech.
 2. If one has 2 separate succos for eating and sleeping, he is mevarech.
 3. If one eats at his friend's succah, and sleeps in his own, he is mevarech.
- B) We will say Hoshanos after Mussaf.

Note: On Simchas Torah, the Hanetz minyan will break after Shacharis, and rejoin the second minyan for Hakafos.

Maariv, Yom Tov ends: 7:08pm (~42min after Shkiah)

Procedure for a Rainy first Night of Succos

If it is raining, make Kiddush in the Succah without Layshaiv, eat a Kezayis of bread and finish the meal inside (Have in mind while washing Netilas Yadayim that you will be changing your Makom during the Seudah and there is no need to make a new Beracha when you resume inside). If it is clear from the forecast that it will rain all night, then you can rely on that and go to sleep. If the rain will be intermittent, then you must wait up until it stops enough that the drips in the Succah would not ruin your food, make a HaMotzi and a Leishev BaSukkah, and eat a little more than a Kebaytza of bread (~2.5 oz or 70 grams).

Lechatchila a person should wait all night to be Mikayem the Gr"a and Rav Moshe Soloveitchick's positions, but if one can't stay up, one can rely on the other Shitos, and if you wake up and it stopped raining, you must eat in the Succah, even if you are Mitztaeir to get there.
